The UK's only high-speed rail network means you can reach Discovery Park in just 70 minutes from London St Pancras. Thanet Parkway is the closest station and an electric shuttle bus runs between the station and site, making your journey a seamless experience.

Thanet Parkway also provides connections to Canterbury in 17 minutes, Margate in 15 minutes, Ashford International in 32 minutes and Broadstairs in 10 minutes.


